Résumé of Experience

EDITORIAL

Beginning in 1999 Mr. Tiley became part of the Forgotten CoastLine, a tourist oriented newspaper distributed from Mexico Beach to St. Marks, Florida's Forgotten Coast. Beginning in 1999 Mr. Tiley built the first web site for the paper, and helped to establish a new publication, The Forgotten Coast Dining and Accommodation Guide. In 2002 Mr. Tiley became advertising director, and signed a contract to purchase the CoastLine Group, which he did in 2003. Until February 1, 2010 he owned and published one of the Forgotten Coast's most popular cultural treasures.

From 1988 to 1996 Mr. Tiley wrote 20 computer related books for Que Books and Howard Sams Publishing (Macmillan Computer Publishing, formerly Prentice Hall Computer Publishing). He has also written columns and articles for DBF Magazine, Windows User Magazine, QBS Software News, and NetGuide Magazine, and was a contributing editor to Clipper Advisor Magazine.

Mr. Tiley, who was represented professionally by Waterside Productions, Literary Agents of Cardiff-by-the-Sea, CA has had his books and magazine articles translated into Greek, Dutch, Hebrew, Italian, French, Polish, Chinese, Portuguese, Japanese, and others.

He has authored "Using Clipper", published Oct. 88; fourth (Special) Edition published January 93, QUE books. Using Clipper is the best selling single volume on the Clipper language of all time, and has been translated into five languages. Co-authored the "dBASE IV Handbook" 3rd Edition, published Feb. 89. QUE books. Authored "dBASE IV Programming Techniques", published May 89. QUE books. Author of "Tricks of the Nintendo Masters" published in June 90 by Howard Sams Publishing under the Hayden Books imprint. Author of "The Clipper Programmer's Reference, published September 91. Author of "Tricks of the Windows 3.1 Masters", published by Howard Sams April 92. Author of "Windows After Hours" and "PCs After Hours" both published by QUE books Jan 93. Recent titles include "Windows Stuff Microsoft Forgot" and "Using MS-DOS 6.2, Special Edition", and the "dBASE 5.0 for Windows Developer's Guide." His book "Windows 95 Unleashed" published by SAMS, Aug 95 was a national bestseller. His last book before turning to life on the Internet was, "Personal Computer Security," for IDG Books of Indianapolis, IN was published in March 1996.

As a freelance writer/photographer for various publications since the 1970's, his credits include: Ebony Magazine, Northern Virginia People Magazine, The Virginia Voice, The Reston Times, Frederick, MD News-Post, and Encore Magazine. Managing Editor of the Virginia Voice, an entertainment and leisure time guide published 1980-81. In the 1980's and 90's Mr. Tiley was a contributing editor to Clipper Advisor, a subscription newsletter

on application development, and Windows User, a general interest monthly magazine published in the US and Europe.

For more than a decade, Mr. Tiley has photographed nearly every facet of life on the Forgotten Coast. His work has been featured in a number of shows and galleries. Nearly all of the unaccredited photographs published in Forgotten CoastLine since 2002 have been his work. Currently his catalog of Forgotten Coast images consists of more than 100,000 photographs in both digital and film formats. This collection will one day become the property of the Florida Photographic Archive.

COMPUTER

From 1987 until 2000, Mr. Tiley served as a software developer, consultant and ultimately as Chief Information Officer for Anchor Realty & Mortgage Co. in Franklin and Gulf Counties in Florida (<http://florida-beach.com>).

For Anchor he created the first PC based reservations software, designed and maintained networking and links between five satellite offices, and created the first web sites along the Forgotten Coast in 1995.

As CIO of a large real estate company with six locations and more than 60 employees he was responsible for all aspects of information technologies including, user support and training, design and implementation of mission critical networking and software resources, all Internet activities including set up and maintenance of NT servers including web servers, terminal servers, file servers, and remote access servers. Web design responsibilities included heading a three person team designing and maintaining five web sites. Mr. Tiley was also responsible for designing and procurement of all printed newsletters and marketing publications released by the company.

Mr. Tiley is the founder (1983) of Data-Train, a computer training and support company formerly affiliated with Washington Office Products of Springfield Va. Data-Train was involved in producing and delivering courseware for Orbcomm International, operator of the world's first commercial low earth orbit satellite constellation, used to deliver near real time global messaging. Data-Train has also worked with the Florida Children's Forum, to update the collection of data used to create the Florida Directory of Early Childhood Services, and was the Project Director for Respect of Florida's e-commerce closed web space, with a mission to make it easier for state and municipal agencies to order products created by disabled Florida residents.

Since 1986 Data-Train has been located in Florida, specializing in vertical market and custom software. Responsible for developing and implementing training classes for microcomputer software, providing consultation and support to end users, designing and maintaining multi-user systems, providing point-of-sale integration of cash registers and computers, as well as designing, installing and supporting custom applications. Clients for these services included the Executive Office of the President of the United States, Westinghouse, U.S. Dept. of Justice, MCI, National Computer Graphics Assn., Internal Revenue Service, National Sport Fishing Assn., U.S.-Yugoslav Economic Council,

American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Association of Retired Persons and others.

As Training Director for TIP Systems of Tallahassee, FL. (1986-87) and as Training Director for ComputerLand Capital City, Tallahassee (1987-89) Mr. Tiley was responsible for developing, marketing and implementing a full slate of microcomputer training seminars. Also responsible for writing and maintaining application programs written with Lotus 1-2-3, dBASE III+ and Rbase 5000. Clients included Executive Office of the Governor, Freshwater Fish and Game Commission, Attorney General's Office, Canon Communications, Bill Thomas Chevrolet, Dept. of General Services, Dept. of Community Affairs, Leon County JTOPA, and others.

From January 1987 to October 1987 Mr. Tiley took a project commission from the Florida Department of General Services, Division of Building Construction to write and document a multi-user, networked application tracking finances and time scheduling of \$500 million in building projects.

Mr. Tiley served for three years (1994-1997) as co-host, with Richard Roccanti, of the "Computer Helpdesk" heard weekly on WTAL in Tallahassee, Florida.

At the age of eighteen Mr. Tiley trained at Reston Cable Television; Reston, Va. in 1970-71. By the time he enlisted in the Army he was responsible for producing the majority of the local programming for the cable system. Productions included all types of studio and remote programming with an emphasis on sports and community affairs.

Worked during Army tour of duty for Armed Forces Outlet, AFRS AM-FM-TV; Asmara, Ethiopia as camera operator, board technician and radio personality. Worked Washington, D.C. radio market at WEER-Warrenton, Va., 1975; Mutual Broadcasting System-Washington, D.C., 1976; WEAM- Arlington, Va., 1976. Freelanced in production of short materials and commercials for WEZR FM, WNVT-TV, Solar Sounds Recording Studio. During 1984-85 hosted "Music of Your Life" at WHGB, Harrisburg, PA.
